Library Building 20th Anniversary Trivia

In 2002, the Orland Park Public Library Board of Trustees placed a referendum on the ballot to build a new facility to be located on 149th and Ravinia Avenue, replacing the Park Lane facility. The referendum passed with two-thirds of the votes in favor of the proposed building!

The Ravinia Avenue Library Building is the third library facility in its history. The first library was located in the Purple Candle Building on 143rd Street. In 1975, Andrew Corporation gave a gift of a new Library Building to the community of Orland Park. That location was located at 14760 Park Lane. After several additions, the building was 26,000 sq. feet. The Ravinia Avenue building is 93,000 sq. feet and has won numerous awards for its building design.

Michael Barnes, an architect from Lohan Anderson, designed the 93,000 sq. foot building and W.E. O'Neil was chosen as the General Contractor.

In late 2019 through 2020, the library underwent a \$3.4 million renovation and repurposing of spaces. Highlights of the renovation include a Tech Center, Teen Loft, Tween Area, Sensory Space, and The Backyard, the library's outdoor nature center. Millennium Park, another Chicago landmark, also debuted in the year 2004.


